- Confirmation of acceptance or confirmation of continuing attendance, at either Holland College or UPEI
- **two** letters of reference (one from the educational institution and one from a person in your community)

Please Note: Below are suggested guidelines for referees to consider when preparing letters of reference for applicants. In no way are they intended to limit the points that referees may wish to address.

- Clearly explain your role and how you know the student
- Talk about the student's character; i.e.- what kind of person they are
- Include information about the student's potential in his/her chosen field of study
- Use examples of the student's achievements to demonstrate why they deserve this scholarship
- Address specific situations in which the student excelled
- Keep the letter no longer than one page (500 words)
