



## Joan Auld Scholarship

This Scholarship Fund was established in 2000 by the Prince Edward Island Crafts Council in honour of Joan Auld. Joan's career was as a Craft Development Officer with the PEI Department of Business Development. She worked for over 30 years to support the craft industry on PEI.

### Conditions of Eligibility

- Applicant must be a Canadian citizen and has been a resident of PEI for at least 6 months prior to application.
- Application must be undertaking full-time studies in a craft-related field at a recognized post-secondary institution.
- The student must demonstrate high school graduation or equivalence (must meet the requirements for entrance into a college program).

### Required Documents

- Portfolio demonstrating previous work, samples of craft-related work, sketches, video or pictures meeting the following criteria:**
  - Do not copy work from others, make sure it is all your own ideas.
  - Be original with your work as the industry expects this of you.
  - Explain your work if you do not feel as though it explains itself.
  - Prepare your portfolio presentation carefully. Take your time, be neat and accurate.
- Typed essay of no more than 500 words telling about yourself; why you wish to become involved with crafts, your background, interests, aims and ambitions for the future.**
- Acceptance letter from the university/college**

- Two letters of reference of no more than 500 words each from people in your community.**

**Below are suggested guidelines for referees to consider when preparing letters of reference for applicants. In no way are they intended to limit the points that referees may wish to address.**

- Clearly explain your role and how you know the student
- Talk about the student's character; what kind of person they are
- Include information about the student's potential in his/her chosen field of study
- Use examples of the student's achievements to demonstrate why they deserve this scholarship
- Address specific situations in which the student excelled
- Keep the letter no longer than one page (500 words)
