- The student must demonstrate high school graduation or equivalence (must meet the requirements for entrance into a college program)

Please ensure the following information and documents are included in this application:

- An outline of the proposed course of study and the name of the institution that you will be attending.
- A typed essay of no more than 500 words telling about yourself; why you wish to become an artisan, your background, interests, aims and your ambitions.
- Portfolio demonstrating previous work, samples of craft-related work, sketches, video or pictures meeting the following criteria:
  - Do not copy work from others, make sure it is all your own ideas.
  - Be original with your work as the industry expects this of you.
  - Explain your work if you do not feel as though it explains itself.
  - Prepare your portfolio presentation carefully. Take your time, be neat and accurate.
- A copy of your acceptance letter from the college or university you will be attending
- Two letters of reference of no more than 500 words each from people in your community. Below are suggested guidelines for referees to consider when preparing letters of reference for applicants. In no way are they intended to limit the points that referees may wish to address.
  - Clearly explain your role and how you know the student
  - Talk about the student's character; what kind of person they are
  - Include information about the student's potential in his/her chosen field of study
  - Use examples of the student's achievements to demonstrate why they deserve this scholarship
  - Address specific situations in which the student excelled
  - Keep the letter no longer than one page (500 words)
