About The Community Foundation of PEI

The Community Foundation of Prince Edward Island provides a well-established means to support philanthropic activities for Prince Edward Islanders to support community needs. We work with donors to find the best ways possible to participate, learn and serve their communities while meeting their charitable goals.

Our mission is to improve the quality of life on PEI through the creation and building of endowment funds that will enhance life for all residents. **We believe we are the ideal organization to handle any donor's philanthropic activities.**

Permanently endowed funds are established and built by donors making tax receiptable gifts which are placed in long term investments. In the case of a gift of securities, the total market value of the securities is endowed, and a charitable tax receipt is issued for the same amount thereby avoiding any capital gains tax.

Once the gift has been received by the Foundation, it is invested in the consolidated endowment portfolio for investment while retaining its individual identify for granting purposes in perpetuity.

Endowments are invested to ensure that their earnings will be adequate to fund the annual granting capacity, along with the cost to operate the fund, and inflation. This ensures the impact remains the same throughout the years.

Fund earnings are used to provide granting according to the donor's wishes to qualified charitable causes. The **Foundation's** policy is to grant 4% of the 4-year average Fair Market Value of each endowment fund on an annual basis. The **Foundation** does not grant any amount that would encroach on the principal amount. On an annual basis, the Foundation examines the donor's granting instructions to ensure the proper allocation and gifting of funds to the appropriate organizations is completed as per the donor vision.

The **Foundation** will always act in a non-biased manner to a donor's best interests to ensure the vision and legacy of each donor is adhered to in providing disbursements in perpetuity. We provide the benefit of allowing donors to create a single endowment fund in support of several causes to assist in achieving the donors' philanthropic goals. Finally, we provide the flexibility for donors to adapt granting wishes to specific areas of support if their original vision changes for any reason.

We hope to assist you in any of your philanthropic desires to leave a legacy as we strive to make Prince Edward Island an even better place to live for the next generation and beyond.

Scholarships

Encouraging and supporting post-secondary students is the reason some donors turn to the Community Foundation of PEI. The goals of the resulting student awards vary widely. Some support graduates of a specific high school, college, university, or program, while others focus on a loved one's special interests.

If you are applying for scholarships, please make note of these items.

- Please ensure you have **ALL** supporting documentation for your application. (Ex: references, transcripts, letters of acceptance, portfolios, etc).
- If applying for multiple scholarships, copies of the support documents must accompany each application. Example: If you are applying for 3 scholarships, you will need to submit 3 transcripts. You cannot submit only one copy.
- Please ensure your name and the scholarship you are applying for is on all supporting documentation.
- Please ensure that reference letters are signed, that they include the contact information
 of the person writing the letter and that it is written, preferably on professional
 letterhead.
- Please provide a complete mailing address including civic or box, city and postal code.
- Please do not submit your application until it is complete.
- Completed applications with all supporting documents can be submitted by email, by regular mail or in person at the Foundation office.
- Please note all scholarship cheques awarded will be issued to the post secondary institution and students.
- Only successful applicants will be notified.
- Please ensure SIN# is provided or NO award will be issued.



Architects' Association of PEI Scholarship

- Successfully completed: one-year post-secondary; OR have graduated high school and have been
 in the work force for at least one-year post graduation; OR entering a post-secondary institution
 that offers accommodations for learners with disabilities
- Pursuing full time studies in Human Services, Business, Sports or Agriculture
- Completed 200 hours in one, or a combination of, volunteer work, sports and charitable organizations
- Not a prior recipient of this scholarship
- Participation as an athlete/volunteer in a national sports event would be considered an asset
- Must provide confirmation of acceptance to a full-time program from a public post-secondary educational institution

The scholarship was created in order to provide financial assistance to students with learning disabilities, so they may be inspired to pursue their dreams through post-secondary education.

This scholarship is awarded to an Island student with specific learning disabilities to attend a post-secondary institution.

Conditions of Eligibility:

- Applicant must be aged 18 to 30 years
- PEI high school graduate or has a Grade 12 equivalent (GED and/or adult education upgrading) who is enrolled full-time at a Canadian post-secondary school
- Documents a learning disability such as Dyslexia, Dyscalculia and or Dysgraphia. Conditions including AD/HD, Asperger's Syndrome and other autism spectrum disorders, Cerebral Palsy, and psychiatric conditions do not alone qualify an applicant for this scholarship. Applicants with these conditions are welcome to apply but must also provide documentation of a specific learning disability
- Demonstrates financial need

- Applicant must be aged 18 to 30 years
- PEI high school graduate or has a Grade 12 equivalent (GED and/or adult education upgrading) who is enrolled full-time at a Canadian post-secondary school
- Enrolled in a Canadian post-secondary school
- Single mother not in a common law relationship
- Demonstrated financial need

- Intend to further full-time studies at UPEI or Holland College;
- Exhibit a level of excellence and leadership in either athletics or arts fields, or in community service or a combination thereof
- Achieved an overall average of 75% during your previous academic year, with no individual subject mark less than 70%
- Provide a transcript of your most recent academic performance endorsed by the educational institution you attend
- Application supported by a minimum of 2 letters of reference and submit a personal statement not exceeding 500 words on how you have personally benefitted from your involvement in athletics or the arts, and your involvement in your community

PEI Protestant Children's Trust Bursary

The PEI Protestant Children's Trust Bursary was established by the PEI Protestant Children's Trust in recognition of its long association with the care and education of Prince Edward Island's Protestant young people.

The Scholarship Fund awards are for Holland College students. First priority will be given to applicants with no living parents; second priority to applicants with only one parent; and third priority to applicants with parents not capable of providing financial support further education as required.

Award recipient will receive 50% of the award on or before the start date of the program and will receive the other 50% at the midpoint of their first year of their program, provided the Registrar confirms the student has good academic standing.

Conditions of Eligibility:

- PEI high school graduate (or equivalent), within the last eight (8) years
- First year student enrolled in a one or two-year course at Holland College
- A PEI resident for five years or more
- Affiliation with a Protestant Church (note from Church agent), regardless of denomination
- Demonstrates good academic standing
- Demonstrates financial need
- Have no living parents; OR have one living parent; OR have two living parents, but they
 are unable to provide financial support for further education

Community Grants

Each year, through the generosity of various donors, the Community Foundation of PEI (CFPEI) is able to provide community grants for various causes throughout the Island. Eligibility

To be eligible for funding an organization must be PEI-based, CRA qualified donee with a registered charitable status, and is not classified as a private foundation. The Foundation will award grants based on the following:

- Organizations with a Registered Charitable Number with the Canada Revenue Agency. If you are not a registered charity you will need to arrange for a registered charity to agree to oversee the project on your behalf
- Projects with definite purposes and that will be covering a specific period of time
- Scholarships and Bursaries will be awarded to educational institutes and not to individuals
- The Foundation encourages the participation of others in funding projects and, on occasion, provides matching funds or challenge grants to boost increased response from other sources

Limitations

The Foundation will NOT consider requests for the following:

- Grants directly to individuals
- Endowment establishment or addition to endowed funds
- Annual campaigns
- Special events or fundraisers
- Sectarian or religious activities
- Party political activities or organizations
- Medical or scientific research projects
- Operating or renovation expenses
- Operating or capital deficits

Application Process

- All applicants will be required to complete the application form and submit requested documentation
- Applicants that receive a grant over \$500 will be required to complete a final report upon completion of the project. The foundation reserves the right to review the project at any time.
- Please note: Only successful recipients will be notified



Reporting and Recognition

We ask that Scholarships and Grants recipients attend the CFPEI Awards Recognition event at The Rodd Charlottetown Hotel at the CFPEI Awards Event in August of each year. You will meet with the Fund Donor representative and receive your award cheque. We ask that you pose for photos and or video clips. Images will be posted on CFPEI website, social media and other media outlets.

For those organizations and groups who receive a grant of \$500 or more, it is requested that they prepare and submit a brief final report upon completion of their project.

Grant award recipients are asked to do the following:

- Acknowledge the financial support of the grant by listing the CFPEI logo in any presentation, publication, signage and promotion, and publicity of the project
- Where possible, list the name the Fund from which you received the grant, so the Fund donor will be acknowledged
- Recognize the support of the CFPEI through your website, and in your annual and/or financial reports
- Upon completion of your project forward to us good-quality photographs related to your project along with signed photo release forms so we can include them in our publications and on our website
